



The above chart shows the CLABSI rate for adult patients in Dana-Farber beds in the inpatient setting. The lower control limit (LCL) and the upper control limit (UCL) are calculations used by Dana-Farber to measure if the CLABSI rates are in fact changing in a way that we should pay close attention to. Any values outside the range prompt investigation to determine special causes for high or low rates.
