- Have a blood relative who has pancreatic cancer that was caused by an inherited change (mutation) in a gene
- Not have had pancreatic cancer
- Not have had genetic testing or counseling for cancer risk before
- Have a healthcare provider and be willing to share genetic test results with that provider and the GENERATE study team
- Be age 18 or older
- Have a U.S. mailing address
- Have access to the internet

Participation includes:

- Online education about genetic testing
- Genetic testing from home, at no cost to you (no need to travel to a clinical site) by mailing in a saliva sample
- Completion of a series of 4 sets of questionnaires over 15 months
